ANNUAL SCHOOL EVALUATION

Wallace Middle School 2011-2012

The 2011-2012 school improvement goals for Wallace Middle School were to implement block scheduling, implement a school wide student advisory program and continue with another book study with all faculty.

Block scheduling was incorporated successfully in the middle school schedule after training had occurred in the prior year. The SOL scores for Geography improved by 10 percent in the blocked class so it seems by this indication it was successful. Students were also pleased with the student advisory program that was initiated, giving them an opportunity to participate in collaborative discussions with the administration and fellow students. Additionally, the faculty enjoyed the book read and discussions were held at faculty meetings.

Wallace Middle School met its goals for the school year but their mathematics scores, especially in seventh grade were terrible, scoring a 13% pass rate. Due to this decline one of the new goals for 2012-2013 is to improve those scores to an 80% pass rate. The school will continue to stress community involvement and a major emphasis will be to train the teachers in the use of the new evaluation system for the county.

Wallace has shown steady improvement in student achievement in some areas and is commended for its outreach programs in the community. It has been a great example of a service learning school in the community. Goals have been set based on the disaggregation of achievement data and the administration provides the leadership to move the school forward and improve the academic achievement in all areas.

- Tutoring is provided before, during, and after school
- Eighth grade students have the opportunity to earn up to three high school credits before leaving middle school (World Geography, Algebra I, and Spanish I)

- Wallace Middle School offers three career and technical exploratory programs—Computer Solutions, Technology, and Agri-Science
- *STAR* testing is done a minimum of three times per year to help chart progress of reading comprehension
- More computer access with new lab set-ups
- IXL Math was introduced to seventh grade students
- Learning Earnings incentive program was implemented in the seventh and eighth grade
